Northeastern's Boston campus hosted Baker, Lt. Gov. Karyn Polito, and their cabinet members to celebrate the start of the administration's fifth-annual STEM Week

Northeastern's Boston campus hosted Governor Baker, Lt. Gov. Karyn Polito and their cabinet members on October 17th to celebrate the start of the administration's fifth annual STEM Week, a five-day campaign to increase awareness of STEM education and employment opportunities. This year, the statewide campaign focuses on the need to support historically underrepresented youth, particularly Black and brown students, "in STEM fields to pursue STEM careers."

Baker began his remarks by quoting Robert Lewis Jr., president, and CEO of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Boston. "He said, 'talent is everywhere, opportunity is not," Baker said. "And the thrust of his point was that we all have to be more intentional about ensuring that everyone who has an inkling or a talent for things like STEM has a chance to discover it and pursue it," Baker said.

Baker noted that the impetus for the creation of STEM Week was twofold: to create "a party" that celebrates STEM, and secondly, "to use that party as a device to encourage all kinds of organizations to do work, to find partnerships in anticipation of STEM week, and then to build on those partnerships after." In a nod to the university's worldwide leadership in scientific research, Baker thanked Northeastern for hosting STEM Week's kickoff.
